What is a DITA Map


- Provides context for the context free topics
- Structures the topics for different requirements: a tutorial, an user manual

Use case







Guided authoring

- “You'll never walk alone!”
 - Contextual hints
 - Seamless editing (text, structure, attributes)
 - Autocorrect + Spellcheck
 - Smart editing assistance
 - Business rules
 - Style guide integration

Reusing content


- Consistent content/messaging
